Thank you to everyone who completed the remote working survey in June. We had really great engagement, with 571 members sharing their insights. We are currently reviewing all of the data but wanted to share some highlevel details from the survey:

• Over 59% of members feel their remote working experience has been very successful.

- A large number of comments focused on the positives of having less of a commute and improved flexibility.
- Members also shared their feedback on the need for more support when it comes to ergonomic issues.

All of the submissions are helpful for future bargaining as they give insight into the successes but also the challenges our members are facing.

**Best part of the job:** There are so many great aspects of my job - I love teaching and science. I also am fortunate to work with a great team of lab instructors! The ultimate reward in my job is seeing the students gain experience and ultimately confidence in the lab. When I get an email from a former student to tell me that they got the job, or were accepted into medical school or a graduate program, I am so happy to know that I helped them succeed!

**Most challenging of the job:** Recently it's been modifying our curriculum and delivery methods because of the pandemic. Our undergraduate lab program has received an exemption to deliver the third and fourth-year lab courses on campus. The exemption will allow students to continue to acquire the necessary lab skills that they need to be successful in future lab courses, and ultimately to be competitive in the workforce following graduation.

**Best part of the job:** My favourite part of the job is working with students, both undergraduate students in the lab courses and graduate students in their role as a teacher. I find it very rewarding to help undergraduate students develop lab skills and watching them as they reach the point that they fully understand it. Every term, with every lab course, I build a new team of lab instructors, made up mostly by graduate students, and I enjoy supporting and guiding them through the term.

**Most challenging of the job:** Recently it's been to rapidly re-develop lab exercises and make them viable in an online setting. Having finished a summer lab course, I can officially say that it is possible to provide an online lab experience for students using

pre-recorded video lessons, Zoom breakout rooms for students and Microsoft Teams to collaborate on assignment questions. We're expecting 550 students in the course this fall!
