Include Title

Section 1. Introduction

- Introduce your topic, including any challenges and/or strengths that you want reviewers to know about.
- How is the proposal timely and relevant?
- How is the project unique or original (is the project filling a gap)?
- State the research question(s) or objective(s).

Section 2. Methodology/Methods

- Describe your methodology (e.g. Indigenous, Participatory Action, Grounded Theory, etc.).
- Describe the specific methods (e.g. survey, interviews, etc.) you will use and why are they appropriate given your topic and research questions/objectives?

Section 3. Significance/Impact

- What skills, training and/or education do you have that makes this research right for you?
- How is this research part of your career trajectory (i.e. how will it contribute to your future career/work)?
- How does your research contribute to the health and wellness of Indigenous communities, collectives, and organizations?
- What is your knowledge sharing plan? (i.e. how will you share the results with those impacted by the research?)
