## WHAT IS CUCOH?

The Canadian Undergraduate Conference on Healthcare (CUCOH) is a three-day conference that enables undergraduate students to engage in hands-on workshops, discussions, and seminars that showcase the multidisciplinary nature of healthcare. CUCOH is not only the largest conference at Queen's, but the largest student-run healthcare conference in Canada. In previous years, CUCOH has welcomed over 250 delegates from 17 universities across Canada.

CUCOH is committed to providing delegates with a rewarding experience that challenges their current perspectives on healthcare. The CUCOH team strives to select a diverse range of speakers, seminars, and discussion topics that are representative of the most current and complex healthcare issues. Delegates engage in a wide variety of interactive workshops, including: suturing, casting, laparoscopic surgery, an anatomy museum, and more!

Our 18th annual conference is centered on the theme "Under the Microscope: The Whole Human," and will be held at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario in February 2023. CUCOH's goal is for delegates to gain an understanding of what a profession in the healthcare industry involves – innovation, collaboration, and a constant pursuit of improvement. Additionally, this year we hope to highlight the multifaceted nature of health and healthcare, considering the intersection of mental and physical wellbeing, and bringing to light novel professions, treatments, and approaches that are not commonly discussed in relation to traditional healthcare. It is my hope that tomorrow's healthcare professionals may begin fostering these qualities today, especially in light of an increasing demand for capable and well-rounded professionals that will make a difference in the Canadian healthcare industry. ## EXTERNAL AMBASSADORS

## **External Ambassadors**

External ambassadors are hired as volunteers to work with the External Relations Coordinators and Chairs of CUCOH, primarily through online communication. They are responsible for the marketing and promotion of CUCOH to students from their university. Additionally, they also work on sponsorship and fundraising to reduce fees associated with travel, hotels, and conference registration. All external ambassadors are required to attend the conference either in-person or virtually, though in-person attendance is strongly encouraged. During the conference, they will act as delegates and participate in the same seminars, workshops, and activities as other attendees. They are also required to pay the same delegate registration fees. However, External Ambassadors are privy to a reduction in registration by \$5 for every delegate registered, up to \$75 off.

## External Delegates

External Delegates are students recruited by External Ambassadors from their university to attend the conference. Ambassadors will provide information about the registration process and answer all questions that potential delegates may have. Having said all this, the role of an External Ambassador is extremely important as in previous years external delegates have made up 75% of all delegates at CUCOH. Without your help this conference would not be the conference it is today and we appreciate all of your time and effort.

## **EXPERIENCES**

Imagine meeting more than 20 healthcare professionals in one weekend. CUCOH provides a variety of activities to interact with them for a great delegate experience.

#### **KEYNOTES**

Keynote speakers are at the forefront of the art and science of healthcare; they put forward big ideas, discuss their own experiences, and offer advice on how students can make a mark on Canadian healthcare. Delegates are challenged to contemplate and deliberate the most pressing issues of the day.

#### **SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS**

This year the CUCOH Executive Team has come up with a new format for scheduling events over the course of the conference weekend. In the past, we've offered delegates three to four seminar options during each seminar block. This year, we will have one or two more seminars running at the same time and two to four workshops in multiple blocks throughout the two days. This allows delegates to attend more workshops, and the seminar choice that they are most interested in. We believe that this set up will allow delegates to personalize their CUCOH experience. We will be bringing in seminar speakers who are passionate experts, ready to engage delegates in an in-depth exploration of specialized topics. Interactive hands-on workshops allow delegates to learn a new skill from experienced professionals in a low-pressure environment. In previous years, biotech coding, acupuncture demonstrations, suturing, dissection of cadavers, casting, and laparoscopic surgery have been successfully incorporated and well-received. This year, in addition to the workshops mentioned, we have many ideas up our sleeves that we hope to incorporate.

## **EXPERIENCES**

## **RESEARCH, POSTER & ORAL COMPETITION**

Hosted on the Saturday of the conference, over 30 student oral and poster presentations, based on original research, will be featured. The competition aims to promote scientific innovation and to encourage research in economic, political, and social aspects of healthcare.

#### CASE CHALLENGES

Teams of delegates will be presented with a case challenge in which they must tackle a current healthcare problem and present feasible solutions. Prizes are awarded for the most innovative and creative solution. Collaboration between students in difference disciplines of study is highly encouraged and supported.

#### **INITIATIVE CAMPAIGN**

A few years ago, CUCOH introduced a new competition to showcase the impact that undergraduate students can have on the healthcare system within their community. CUCOH is currently looking for student leaders who volunteer diligently in their community to support the health and well-being of those around them and themselves. These students will present their initiatives in front of the delegates of CUCOH who will choose their favourite initiative. The winner will receive a cash prize to help fund their initiative.

#### **INFORMATION FAIR**

The Information Fair is a unique event held throughout the conference weekend. Our sponsors and partners are placed in direct contact with 164 delegates. Each partner is featured at a display booth where they can showcase their organization's unique perspective, experience, and promotional materials.
