- In April 2014, the University moved from a 4.0 to a 4.3 GPA scale. The 4.0 scale differed from the current scale in two ways: on both the graduate and undergraduate scales the A+ and A grades both earned 4.0 grade points; on the undergraduate scale only the D range included D+ (55% to 59%) and D (50% to 54%) grades, but no D-.
- Graduate programs, grade below which a course must be repeated:
  - 2004 to March 2015: C+ (68%)
  - March 2015 to April 2017: D- (50%)
  - Since April 2017: B- (70%)
- Effective Spring/Summer 2024, a single asterisk (\*) will represent the final retake of a course. Prior to Spring/Summer 2024, a single asterisk (\*) represents the best grade of a retaken course
- Effective Spring/Summer 2024, an F# grade will indicate the failure of a Pass/Fail course. Prior to Spring/Summer 2024, the failure of a Pass/Fail course is indicated with an F grade.
