

Some rules - I now understand, respect, and would not break again!

Others - meh, no big deal.

circular needles
are smoother
than straight

don't mix different
weights of wool

swatch first

be competent at math
don't make vertical lines
or long horizontal ones

don't carry wool behind the fabric for a long time

personal - I use it to analogize to law all the time. Eg. that I like untangling knitting problems so law can be like that too.

political: knitting has a place on all parts of the TBTE "iceberg" image. For some a luxury hobby. For some, just paid work, no fun. 



This consideration is absent from the "business is business" framework.



"Private ownership is presented as the most efficient means of managing open-access resources." C126




1. bread and roses

2. fair trade coffee


- "take back the markets"


