Early Years Conference

Parent Survey

Project Manager, Theresa has also been working closely with project co-leads, Community Council members and PAC on developing a parent survey. The survey is being piloted by our PAC and community researchers Symbia, Brenda and Kate. Pending ethics approval, the survey will be available in paper and online formats in April-May 2022. MOSAIC will assist with translation.

Our intrepid parent community researchers, Symbia Barnaby in Prince Rupert and Brenda Lenahan in Tahsis have guided the development of the parent survey, recruitment plans, data collection approaches and methods, and much more! Our youth community researchers have helped to inform the parent survey, communication materials, recruitment and data collection approaches. Kate Gibbs in Invermere is helping with our Facebook page and will assist with the literature scoping review that is currently underway.

ECD Community Researchers

Our two early child development community researchers Crystal Kalas at Fort St John CDC and Cheryl Work at Northwest CDC in Fort St James are completing community profiles and environmental scans of their agencies' use of information and communication technologies, including policies and practices. Crystal and Cheryl will also assist with gathering parent survey data. Thanks to Crystal for being a co-presenter at the Early Years Conference.

Scoping Literature Review

Project co-lead Alison Gerlach and her doctoral student Amarens Matthiesen, are working on a scoping literature review. This involves collating and analyzing Canadian literature published in the last 10 years on how information and communication technologies have been used in diverse community settings to support children with extra support needs. This review will help to inform the work in year 2 of our project and will be submitted for publication later this year.

BC Association of Aboriginal Friendship Centres

In partnership with the BC Association of Aboriginal Friendship Centres, we will apply for a TELUS Friendly Futures Foundation grant. The focus will be on developing a community profile and environmental scan of the Hiiye'yu Lelum House of Friendship in Duncan and support their strategic changes to enhance access to ECD and health services for Indigenous families in rural areas of central Vancouver Island through the use of information and communication technologies.
