

Copies of the documents needed to prove your current income:

- Copies of your 3 most recent tax returns together with attachments, if any;
- A copy of every notice of assessment or re-assessment issued to you by Revenue Canada for the three most recent tax years;
- If you are an employee, your most recent statement of earnings indicating total earnings (including overtime) paid in the year to date, or a letter from your employer indicating total earnings (including overtime) paid in the year to date;
- If you are receiving Employment Insurance benefits, copies of the 3 most recent benefit statements;
- If you are receiving social assistance, a statement confirming the amount you receive;
- If you are receiving workers compensation, copies of your 3 most recent benefit statements;
- If you are self-employed, for the three most recent taxation years you will need:
 - (i) the financial statements of your business or professional practice, other than a partnership, and
 - (ii) a statement showing a breakdown of all salaries, wages, management fees or other payments or benefits paid to, or on behalf of, persons or corporations with whom the spouse does not deal at arm's length ;
- If you are a partner in a partnership, confirmation of the your income and draw from, and capital in, the partnership for its three most recent taxation years;
- If you control a corporation, for its three most recent taxation years you will need:
 - (i) the financial statements of the corporation and its subsidiaries, and
 - (ii) a statement showing a breakdown of all salaries, wages, management fees or other payments or benefits paid to, or on behalf of, persons or corporations with whom the corporation, and every related corporation, does not deal at arm's length;

- ❑ If you are a beneficiary under a trust, a copy of the trust settlement agreement and copies of the trust's three most recent financial statements.
