3. Have you heard of the “40/20/40” approach to writing? How about the 10/20/30 rule of PowerPoint?  
Guy Kawasaki states, “I am evangelizing the 10/20/30 Rule of PowerPoint. It’s quite simple: a PowerPoint presentation should have **ten slides**, last no more than **twenty minutes**, and contain **no font smaller than thirty points**.”
